Structural Changes

As previously reported, the college will shortly start developing the area at the rear of the garden. In preparation for this we have started to demolish the sheds and will store them in the hope that we can rebuild them again in the garden.

There has been some deterioration of the plastic shades on the gazebo and some of the panels have become loose in the wind. We are investigating options for repair/replacement.

Other projects identified include:

- Extension of rows to align them
- Developing more garden beds
- Creating open compost bins to improve our use of organic waste.

We are awaiting a report from Education Department on the condition of the gum trees in the garden. The outcome of the survey will determine if they can be retained or removed.

Frangipani Festival (Proposed)

Frangipani Friends of Perth is a network of enthusiasts – who grow frangipani's as a business or hobby. They are planning a festival to be held in the college on Saturday 4 April. On the day there will be a number of stalls featuring the many varieties and colours of frangipani. There will also be other garden related products, entertainment and food.

We have an opportunity to participate in the festival and are currently considering what we might do. A sausage sizzle and information booth are firm favourites but we should look at other options as well. It will be great exposure for the garden and a way of bringing to the site people who may not otherwise know of our existence. Visitors are expected from all over Perth and not just the local area. Busy Bees and Committee Meetings

The last busy bee (19 January) was the first twilight working session for the season. We had a great turn out of members, including several new members, who came along and helped with maintenance jobs. We have now cleared all beds of spent produce and there was plenty to share at the end of the session.

Beds are ready for top up, composting and preparing for next season's planting. We are hoping to raise some seedlings to supplement those that we will buy. If you are interested in raising some seedlings at home to be brought to the garden for planting at a later date, please let me know.
